School Profile

We are a Family of Schools, closely connected and serving about 15 small or tiny communities.

Jewett has just under 10 learners from Kindergarten to grade 6 with a strong focus on Aboriginal Education and outdoor learning in a multiage model.

JVH has just over 215 students in grades Kindergarten to 12. Both schools have a StrongStart centre.

JVH has a very high graduation rate, with students successfully pursuing college, trades and university opportunities.

Our catchment covers a large area, where resourcefulness, interdependence and rural living are valued. We are fortunate to work with a variety of community organizations, such as North Kootenay Lake Community Services, Community Paramedics, Periwinkle Day Care, Trails Society, the Village of Kaslo and many more.

We have a Health Hub with services from physicians, options for sexual health, drug misuse counseling, and art therapy offered to our students.

We are working with our community partners to build an outdoor classroom which will open September 2022.

Numeracy

Goal Statement

- Numeracy

 - o Developing increasingly stronger numeracy skills (number skills, number concepts, Visual-spatial thinking, attitudes)

Rationale

Number sense is critical to students' mathematical vocabulary for fluency in processes. Problem attack strategies, and comprehension of mathematical problems, is a growth area for students K-12, and increases with complexity of questions as students go through the grades.

Increasing FSA, Provincial Assessment scores and looking at school-wide problem-solving assessments.
