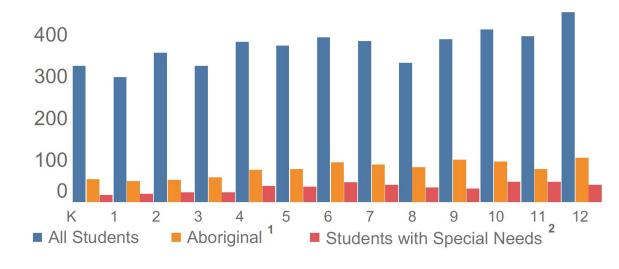

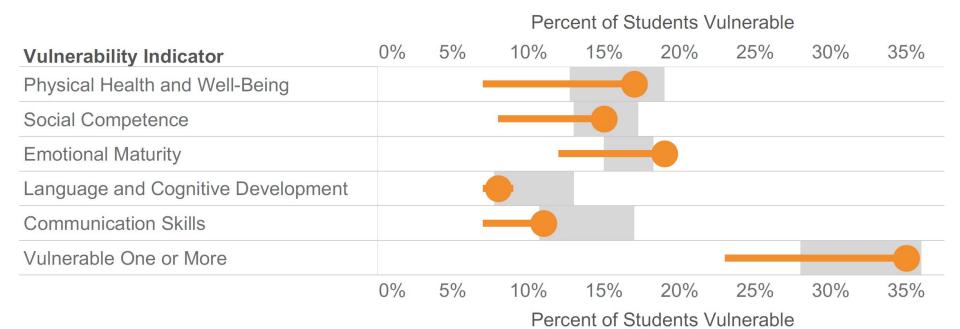


#### Total Students Across All Grades (2018/19)

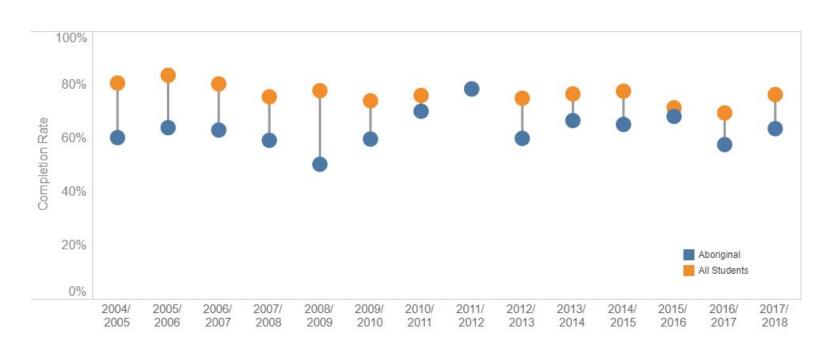

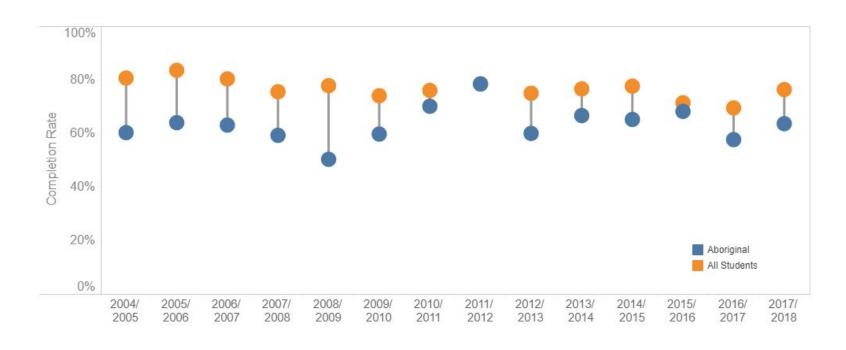
# Completion Rates Aboriginal and All Students

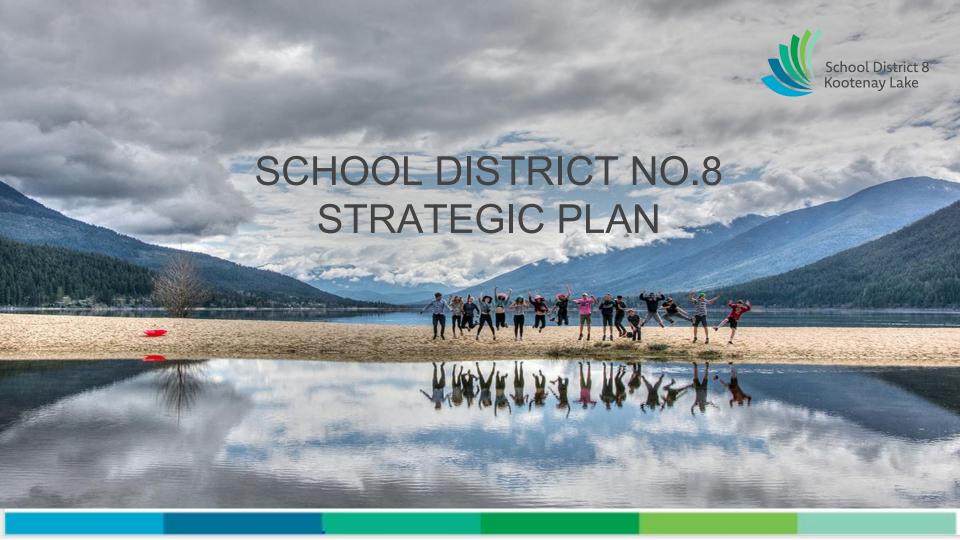

    - Capital Funds Per Revenues
    - Operating Expenses "SAME SAME"
    - Staffing, Services & Supplies
      - Same-Same, subject to Equity Analysis
    - Discretionary & Review of Non-Basic (if applicable)

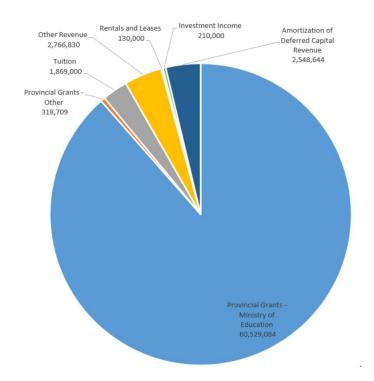

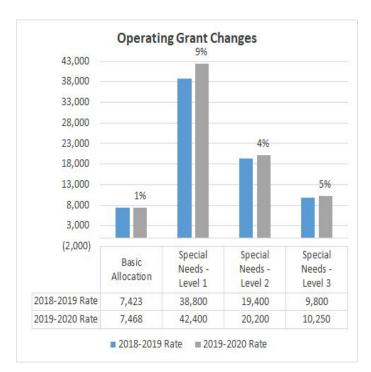

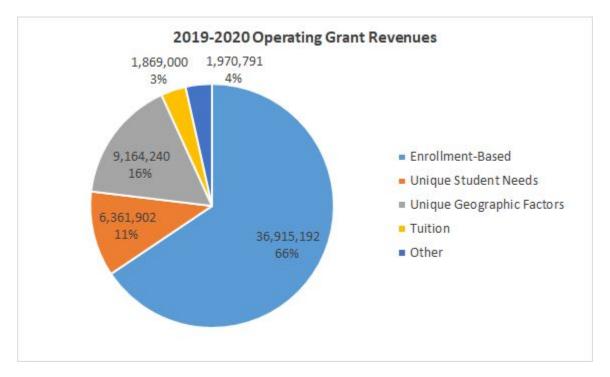
# 2019-2020 Revenues Operating Grant Changes







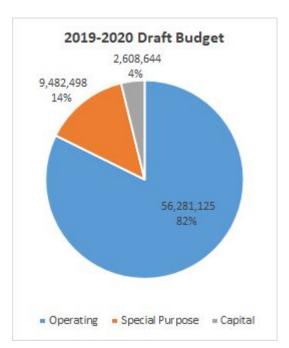

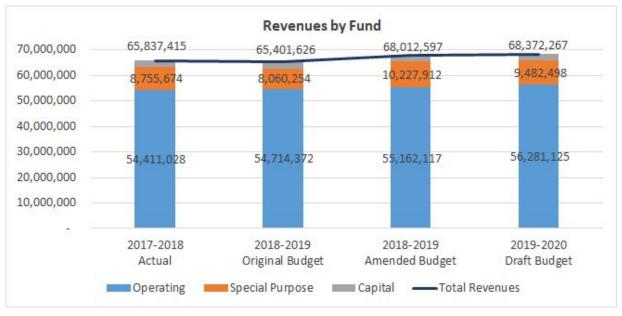




## 2019-2020 Revenues By Fund

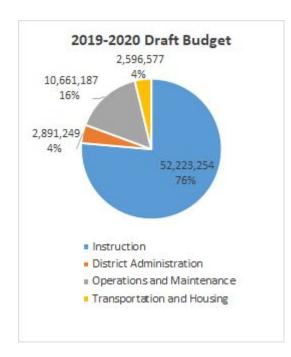


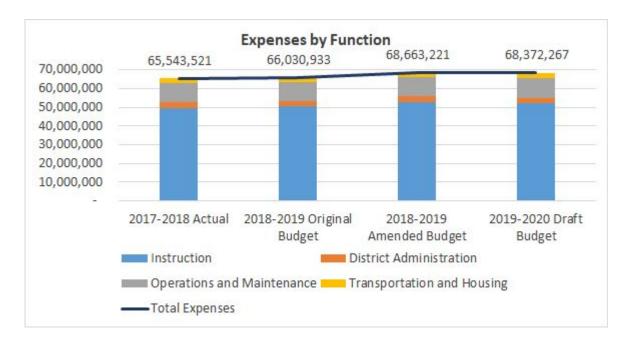




# 2019-2020 Expenses By Function

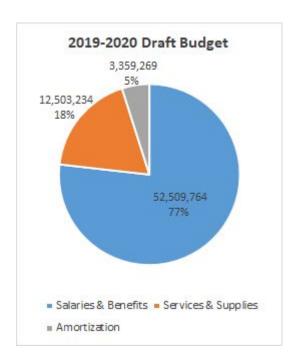


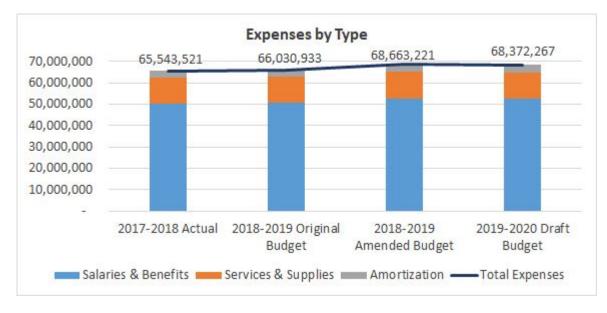




## 2019-2020 Expenses By Type

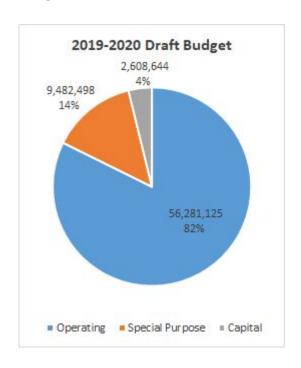


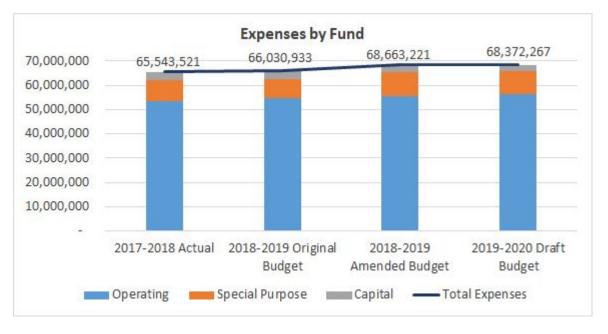

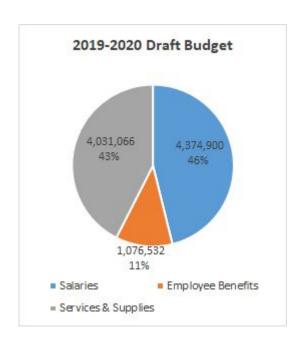

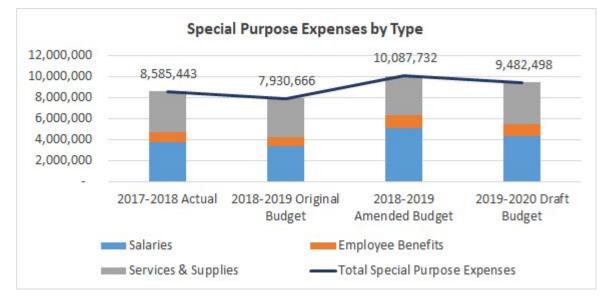

#### New Capital Spending Comes From:

- Annual Facilities Grant (Capital Portion)
- Certificates of Approval (COAs) from Various Funding Envelopes
- Any Transfers (i.e. Capital Investments Made) from Operating Fund or Special Purpose Fund

#### 2019-2020 New Capital Grants - Total \$2,674,762

- Annual Facilities Grant Capital Portion \$1,094,762
- School Enhancement Program LVR Dust Collector \$300,000
- School Enhancement Program Hume \$750,000
- School Enhancement Program Various \$425,000

# Existing Board-Owned Facilities & Land Summary

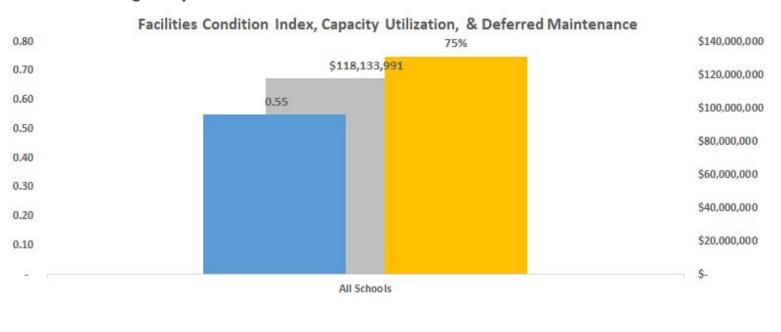


- Board-owned Properties:
